## Small Development Grant Scheme 2018-22

The Museum Development Yorkshire Small Grants Fund can provide funding for a variety of projects in your museum. Our Small Development Grant Scheme assists museums to implement advice, test new ways of working and make good things happen. It also supports personnel to attend training courses and conferences.

The amount awarded is up to £3,000 per project with a sliding scale of match funding required. The fund for this financial year is now live and available on an open application basis, with assessments made on a monthly basis. All monies must be spent and claimed by the end of the financial year.

## Calling All North Yorkshire Museums Collecting Archaeological Material

### Responses requested by end of March

At the Yorkshire Museum we are updating our Deposition Policy for Archaeological Archives for North Yorkshire and as part of this process we need to clearly define our geographical collecting area to ensure that there is provision across the whole county and to identify any potential overlaps in collecting.

UBP offers a programme of seminars, collection visits, Fellowships, and a resource-rich website to enable professionals to share new research, best practice, and innovative case studies.
