# **Art Fund Covid-19 Impact Survey Full Report Available Now**

The summary of recent research offers insights into how the pandemic has impacted museums and galleries, what museums need, and how Art Fund support can be adapted over the coming weeks and months.

The report is divided into two parts, the first focuses on the current sector landscape – establishing what is and isn't happening now, key concerns, the impact on collections and curatorial practice, and on communications and operations.

The second section of the report focuses on Art Fund's response, and how we can expand our programme to support museums and galleries in new ways. It explores how helpful our existing activity is now, and the areas of support that will be most needed in the months ahead.

# **Pannett Art Gallery's Painting of the Week**

Pannett Art Gallery have involved an important Whitby resident to introduce their 'Painting of the Week'. The Town Mayor, Councillor Linda Wild introduces each painting via video! The paintings are also being used as a resource for local community groups, including a range of health and/or caring organisations - many of whom are really struggling with huge demand on their services due to Covid-19.

Some of the befriending services supporting vulnerable adults and disability groups have clients who depend on regular phone contacts, but it isn't always easy to maintain lively and varied conversations. Pannett Art Gallery's curator, Helen



Berry, has created simple prompts to accompany the selected paintings and emails them to the groups, who are using these resources with some of their clients.

Helen commented: 'In the last Health and Wellbeing project I delivered with MDY funding we used our paintings as conversation / reminiscence prompts in care homes in Whitby. The knowledge I gained from that project is now influencing my decision on which paintings to select each week and the prompts I am writing'.

# **Escaping Lockdown Grants Grants assessed weekly - apply now**

## **MDY Small Development Grants 2018-22**

In response to the current crisis we are launching a grant fund to help you better survive now and prepare to reopen and relaunch your museum.

We are encouraging projects of £500 to £1000, with NO match funding. We do require a clear project plan that addresses either:

- A key immediate issue that has resulted from the current lockdown
- · Helps you connect with audiences while you are closed
- Helps you engage with volunteers and staff while your museum is closed
- The reopening and relaunching of your museum including measures to make your visitors and your staff and volunteers feel safer while on site

We require a clear action plan that relates to your museum's key purpose and, if possible, a timetable. We recognise that we are still in uncertain times so if the plan or timetable needs to change, we are prepared to be flexible as the situation develops.

The fund is now live and available on an open application basis, with assessments carried out weekly. All monies must be spent and claimed by the end of the financial year. We strongly advise you to speak to your Museum Development Officer before submitting your application.

- Which deadline you are aiming to submit your application
- How you want to be contacted (phone / video conference)
- Contact name, email, phone number (and video conference username if appropriate) Skype username if you want to use that; email alone is fine for Zoom or Google Meet)
- If you have drafted an application, a copy of that text.

We get lots of cow parsley in the fields around us. It looks like effervescent champagne and we sometimes nickname them 'champagne fields'.



Anthriscus sylvestris, known as cow parsley, wild chervil, wild beaked parsley, or keck, is a herbaceous biennial or short-lived perennial plant common along verges and grassy areas in spring. It is an early source of nectar for pollinators and beneficial insects.
