### Reopening Support

MDY recognises that every museum will be making a decision on when to reopen based on their own individual situation, involving a multitude of different factors. With that in mind, we have commissioned a suite of different training, and over the coming weeks will also highlight practical resources available.

We are mindful that museums are at different stages in this process, and resources are aimed at both supporting museums to make an informed choice about reopening, and providing tips and advice to those who continue to evolve their new operations as staff, volunteers and visitors return to on site.

### Prosper North: providing business support for cultural heritage organisations in the North of England

#### Application deadline: 3 August

Prosper North is a free business support programme funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, and delivered by Creative United in partnership with Key Fund, Bates Wells and Social Investment Business.

The programme aims to improve the capabilities of around 80 organisations in the North of England – from music venues to community art groups, and independent museums to literature festivals. The programme is designed to increase income and impact and provide support in becoming more resilient businesses.

Currently, they are in the final stages of applications for the last edition of the programme - the deadline for applying is 3 August.



## Reopening Resources

### MDY Recovery Funding Grant Scheme - Out Now

Thanks to the Art Fund and Arts Council England we are able to launch a new recovery grant scheme designed to reach parts that other funds cannot.

MDY'S Recovery Grant Scheme has awards of £3K - 10K to support museums recover well from this crisis. We have at least £35,000 of grants to distribute and the application form will be open until 30 September with one assessment round after all bids are in. After this, the team will be wrapping cool towels around their heads and working out which museums will benefit most from this investment.

We know that for many museums, reopening is the easy bit (even if it doesn't feel that way now). Recovering well is going to be a long haul and we want to help make it as successful as possible. We will open the application form by August but our guidance notes are available now at

### Major Art Prize Goes Virtual

While The Stanley & Audrey Burton Gallery is working on plans to safely re-open to everyone, you can still enjoy the freshest talent from Leeds' budding art scene from home.

The annual FUAM Graduate Art Prize is going virtual! Now in its eighth year, the prize and exhibition, supported by the Friends of University Art & Music (FUAM), rewards the artistic excellence of students completing BA studies in Art and Design and Fine Art at the University of Leeds in 2020.

## Funding Opportunities

### Arts Council National Lottery Project Grants

*Arts Council England have issued the following statement:*

'On 22 July we'll be open again for applications, with a budget of £59.8 million available until April 2021. After a brief closure of the fund in the immediate aftermath of the Covid-19 crisis, we are pleased to say that National Lottery Project Grants will be back later in July.

We're making improvements to make the fund more responsive to the needs of smaller independent organisations and individual practitioners during Covid-19. We have prioritised reopening this programme to help fund independent organisations, creative practitioners and freelancers as quickly as possible. We'll publish updated guidance for the programme by mid-July'.

### A Curious Royal Find

My wife's long-deceased uncle was a slightly obsessive private collector of Stuart historical material.

One of his most curious finds was as a result of being approached by a provincial dealer who had an old jewel in which he might be interested. The dealer told him that he had an interesting locket which claimed to be from someone called 'Reenie Scosha' but that he did not know much more about it.

Indeed, as it turned out, it was an important find that the uncle probably obtained at a reasonable price. His connoisseur's eye recognised what it was an important piece of jewellery which contained a lock of hair from Mary Queen of Scots (French 'Marie reine d'Écosse'). He added it to his extensive collection of material associated with this ill-fated monarch.
