Reopening Support

MDY recognises that every museum will be making a decision on when to reopen based on their own individual situation, involving a multitude of different factors. With that in mind, we have commissioned a suite of different training, and over the coming weeks will also highlight practical resources available.

We are mindful that museums are at different stages in this process, and resources are aimed at both supporting museums to make an informed choice about reopening, and providing tips and advice to those who continue to evolve their new operations as staff, volunteers and visitors return to on site.

MDY Small Development Grant Scheme - Paused Due to Popular Demand

Who knew that sticky tape and sanitiser would be so popular?

We responded to demand, created 'Escaping Lockdown' grants and the money has now liberated many miles of social distancing signage, contactless ticketing systems and hand sanitiser into your museums. So much so, we rattled the budget tin and found coppers left at the bottom.

So, from Friday we are pausing our Small Development Grant scheme and the Escaping Lockdown Grants.

We will then search behind our sofa cushions to find some more money. Any partial applications will be kept warm and dry to be completed at a later date. If we are able to reallocate some money then we will reopen the scheme. If we can't, then we'll be keeping it closed until next year - plenty of time for you to work up new projects and get everyone excited about them

But wait.... there's more...

Thanks to the Art Fund and Arts Council England we are able to launch a new recovery grant scheme designed to reach parts that other funds cannot.

MDY is launching a Recovery Grant Scheme with awards of £3-10K to support museums recover well from this crisis. We have at least £35,000 of grants to distribute and the application form will be open until 30 September with one assessment round after all bids are in. After this, the team will be wrapping cool towels around their heads and working out which museums will benefit most from this investment.

We know that for many museums, reopening is the easy bit (even if it doesn't feel that way now). Recovering well is going to be a long haul and we want to help make it as successful as possible. We will open the application form by August but our guidance notes are available now at

These sessions will support your skills and knowledge to apply COVID-secure guidelines to welcoming visitors back to your reopened museum.

Museum Reopening Guidance

New guidance was published on Thursday 25 June by the National Museum
Directors' Council (NMDC) with support from DCMS and the Museums and
Galleries Working Group. The 'Coronavirus COVID-19 NMDC Good Practice
Guidelines for Reopening Museums after 4th July 2020' guidance is intended to
help employers, employees, the self-employed and volunteers in the museum
sector in England understand how to work safely during the COVID-19
pandemic.

To assist museums in their strategic decision making, AIM and the Museum
Development Network have produced a 'Reopening Checklist' to be used in
conjunction with the Guidelines. As every museum is unique there will be no
'one way' to do things. The checklist does not tell you exactly how your
reopened museum should operate but it is intended to help you develop your
reopening plans and provides you with a methodology to follow.

• Visit Britain also announced the launch of a UK-wide industry standard and consumer mark, in partnership with the national tourist organisations of Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales to provide a 'ring of confidence' for tourism as the sector works towards reopening. Observing Nature with the British Trust for Ornithology

There has been a reported increase in people birdwatching and taking the time to look at the nature around them. If you are doing this you can take part in one of the British Trust for Ornithology's citizen science projects.

For example, you can log your weekly observations of the birds in your garden for the Great Garden Birdwatch. This can be as little as 20 minutes a week and is currently free to take part in.

Funding Opportunities

National Lottery Project Grants Return on 22 July

'On 22 July we'll be open again for applications, with a budget of £59.8 million available until April 2021. After a brief closure of the fund in the immediate aftermath of the Covid-19 crisis, we are pleased to say that National Lottery Project Grants will be back later in July.

We're making improvements to make the fund more responsive to the needs of smaller independent organisations and individual practitioners during Covid-19. We have prioritised reopening this programme to help fund independent organisations, creative practitioners and freelancers as quickly as possible. We'll publish updated guidance for the programme by mid-July'.

NLHF Heritage Emergency Fund Updated Guidance and Application Deadline

Applications to NLHF's Heritage Emergency Fund scheme can now be made before 12 noon on 31 July. A few additional changes have been made to eligible costs which now include:

- · Costs associated with reopening safely and in line with Government guidance
- Stabilising your organisation
- Preparing for recovery, including strategic reviews of business models, operating plans and business plans, and investment to enable digital delivery of services.
