Congratulations to all our colleagues who have been successful in securing investment from the Culture Recovery Fund. We know this funding from DCMS will help many museums remain solvent and keep engaging with audiences and looking after their collections. We have also been able to invest £35,000 in a further five museums through our MDY Recovery Grants. This has been made possible by Arts Council England and the Art Fund (but more about that in a future newsletter).

In this week's bulletin we have news of next month's <u>Takeover Day from Kids in Museums</u>, details of Arts Council England's '<u>Developing Your Creative Practice' fund</u> for individual cultural and creative practitioners, plus several <u>webinars and online workshops</u> on subjects ranging from funding to personal resilience. All of this is making us think about the future and how we can learn from each other to plan for uncertainty.
