ACE Brexit Transition Guide


Arts Council England (ACE) have published a guide that provides information to help organisations prepare for the end of the Transition Period on 31 December 2020, now that the UK has left the European Union.

Dieter's Nature Notes - Fruitful Fungus

Autumn is the classic time for the emergence of the fruiting bodies of fungi and this year seems to be a particularly bumper year in our garden with a number of different varieties emerging.



The most striking, Verdigris Fungus (*Stropharia aeruginosa*), has a distinctive bluegreen colour and glutinous cap. It is one of very few blue-green fungi. In most instances the caps are much nearer to green than to blue, but when young and fresh they are quite startling. Initially bell-shaped, the caps flatten and turn paler from the centre. White scales adorn young caps of this remarkable fungus, which is a native of woodland and gardens and has sprung up in our garden on the ground up stump remains of a long-dead cherry tree.

The next remarkable but more common example is the Shaggy Inkcap (*Coprinus comatus*). Commonly known as the Shaggy Mane or Lawyer's Wig fungus because of its similarity to long hair or the headpieces traditionally used by lawyers in court. This common fungus is often seen growing on lawns, along gravel roads and waste areas. The young fruit bodies first appear as white cylinders emerging from the ground, then the bell-shaped caps open out. It is reputed to be edible when young but whenever considering culinary use of any fungi, extreme caution should be used by the inexperienced. As one curator in Gdansk once told me: 'in Poland all mushrooms are edible – but some of them only once!'
