John Roles, Obituary

Sadly, John Roles, Head of Museums and Galleries at Leeds City Council passed away last week after a long illness.

John joined Leeds City Council from Brighton in 2004 and oversaw the transformation of the city's nine museums and galleries sites including the development of the Leeds Discovery Centre and redevelopment of Leeds City Museum and Leeds Art Gallery. Under his leadership, visitor figures in Leeds rose from 358,000 in 2004/05 to 1,698,640 in 2018/19.

John invested hugely in the development of his team, encouraging leadership, experimentation and innovation. Yvonne Hardman, interim head of Leeds Museums

share his expertise in national and international initiatives.

One of his greatest skills was to empower his staff to become leaders and influencers, supporting them to experiment and be creative. John was part of, and encouraged his teams to be part of, networks and partnerships, supporting the museum and gallery sector regionally and nationally.'

In addition to leading the team in Leeds, John had a lifelong commitment to the importance of arts, museums and culture being a Trustee at the Thackray Medical Museum. He also played a significant role with the Leeds Art Fund, Leeds Craft and Design Gallery and the Leeds Philosophical Society. Beyond that, John used his knowledge, experience and influence to support the development of the museum community across the region and country.

He will be sadly missed.

Sift gently through your collections and see if you can whip up any historical Christmas recipes - mince pies, gingerbread, sugar-plums, or maybe something more unusual? BOIL a quarter of a Pound of Sugar in a Glass of Verjuice, or Lemon Juice, and when it is wasted half, put to it some Cream, with the Yolks of half a dozen Eggs, Orange-slowers, Lemon-peel candy'd grated; a little beaten Cinnamon, and a little Butter. Put these into a Tart made of sine Paste, and bake it without a Lid.

Curators' Christmas Objects:

Victorian Wassail Doll from York Museums Trust

Thank you to Helen Thornton, Curator of Social History at York Museums Trust, for this fascinating object! Open this oval wassail box to discover the dolls inside which represent Christ and the Virgin Mary. Wassailing, once a common Christmastide blessing custom going back several hundred years had mostly died out by the start of the 20th century. Dating from 1870 - 1900, this box would have been carried from house to house by women and children. The box lid would have been raised, revealing the contents to those who donated food or money. Wassail boxes were a custom unique to Yorkshire, Durham, and other northern areas, sometimes replacing the more well-known practice of drinking from a wassail cup or bowl.

Dieter's Christmas Challenge

Here's a second historic Christmas object from Dieter's personal treasure trove ...

Felix is a cartoon character that was created in the silent film era, first appearing in a 1919 cartoon Feline Follies, although he didn't get his name until the third cartoon he appeared in. He was a massive success in the cinema and in merchandise. Pat Sullivan, the owner of the film studio, and copyright of the characters created by his animators, made \$100,000 from licensing the Felix character in 1923.

As a result Felix was the first licensed and mass merchandised cartoon character and was widely reproduced as soft toys, such as this one, and other products such as ceramics, toy figures and postcards.

Felix's popularity began to wane with the coming of sound to cartoons, in the late 1920s. Mickey Mouse's sound films made the silent offerings of Sullivan, and animator

icon of popular culture. In this toy he is modelled in his characteristic pose as 'Felix keeps on walking with his hands behind his back' which also featured in a song and comedy Fox Trot dance which was the rage in London and a hit for the Savoy Havana band in 1923 - see www.youtube.com/watch? w=ulvPiWhkKQY.
