## **Support for Carers**

## Why Don't You Just Switch Off Your Computer and Go and Do Something Less Boring Instead? Can we help?

We know there are loads of exciting CPD (Continuing Professional Development) opportunities out there now. We also know that there are barriers, attitudes and issues that can make it difficult for you to take part.

If your museum wants to support you to attend an online workshop or conference but there is an obstacle, we can support your organisation with a small grant. This could pay for a support worker to take over your carer duties for an afternoon or the cost of an alternative technology that makes attending easier.

Before Covid-19 hit, we planned to offer bursaries to support adaptations or costs associated with dependent care provision for people to attend conferences. There are similar challenges now conferences are online. We don't have an answer but we want to help, please contact your MDO.

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
