MDY Update

New National Restrictions

The Government announced new national restrictions as a result of Covid-19; from Thursday 5 November until Wednesday 2 December museums and galleries must close to the public.

Your financial sustainability - Now is the time to reassess your cash flow projections. We can support you. This <u>useful Excel template</u> is from the Culture Recovery Fund guidance.

If your museum is at risk of insolvency over the next six months, please contact us by email or <u>via this form</u>. MDY and ACE want to make DCMS aware of museums at risk. We can then work together to help you.

Remember, **Arts Council National Lottery Project grants** are open for applications! Currently you don't need to find match funding. For more information look at the **Arts Council National Lottery Project Grants website**.

MDY Small Grants will reopen shortly, if there are smaller projects that will help you prepare to reopen and recover. The application form is on the <u>landing page of our website</u>.

Staff costs - The government has new guidance on the <u>furlough scheme and</u> <u>economic support news pages</u>.

Caring for your volunteers - Specific government advice on volunteering will be updated on the **DCMS volunteering guidance page**. The **www.heritagevolunteeringgroup.org.uk** is a great source of advice.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our survey about returning to face-to-face working. Whilst our short-term plans have been overtaken by the return to lockdown, the survey results will inform our procedures for safe face-to-face working when this is possible.

communications. We will also be aiming to make our remote working practices increasingly accessible and inclusive, e.g. by varying some of our networking meeting times.

Looking forwards to the lifting of lockdown, we will initially prioritise individual site visits where these are integral to the support being provided, where the service cannot be delivered remotely, and where this can be done safely.

We will also plan for some Covid-safe, face-to-face group meetings from spring 2021, in the cautious hope that these will be possible.

We have gained a new appreciation of some of the benefits of online contact, but we still very much appreciate the value of meetings in person, and look forward to this being possible. In the meantime, we will continue developing our own skills and practices around remote delivery, from phone calls to group video calls.
