# New programme to help museums facing financial constraints



Starting in February 2021, this new National Lottery Heritage Fund programme (delivered by the Social Enterprise Academy), will provide a pathway of support to address the increasing financial pressures faced by heritage organisations. The 14 month programme will help organisations build stronger partnerships and become more comfortable with the commercial aspects of running a heritage organisation.

Round 1 is open to Yorkshire applicants now and the programme costs £50 per person (£100 per organisation if two people are attending).

Some were a bit quirky and reflect how things have changed over the years; a couple pick up on earlier postings and one seems quite shocking 60 years on! # **Christmas Tree Decoration from Wakefield Museums**

From Stephanie Webb: an early plastic Christmas tree decoration in the form of 'bunnykins' made in Japan in c.1920s/30s

# Carolling Card from Colne Valley Museum

From Anne Lord: 'These decorated cards, c.4"  $\times$  2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", were delivered by carol singers in the Colne Valley as

they went round the village on Christmas Eve. The set of cards was donated by a lady in her eighties: "I have a dim idea that cards such as these were left by singers who started singing 'Christians Awake' at people's door. Never before the clock struck 12. They were collected Christmas morning I think, or maybe Boxing Day. It is a long time ago."

'Further research confirmed this and in a copy of Colne Valley Carols\* we found a description of the carol singers' traditions: "years ago carol singers set out from Carr Lane at 11.30pm then returned to the Sunday School around 2.00am on Christmas morning for pie and peas. Being suitably refreshed, the singers moved to Manchester Road side of the valley, and on completion a final carol was sung around the Christmas tree at around 5.00 am. The more energetic members, after snatching a few hours sleep, went door to door collecting for chapel funds, which ended at 11.00 am."

'\*The villages in the Colne Valley each have their own special carol, mostly written by local people, although often using a well-known tune. I have fond memories of teaching this carol (from Meltham) to my class.'
