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



Dame Margaret Weston died on 12 January 2021 aged 94. She was a remarkable figure in the world of museums as the first woman in the UK to run a national museum and a pioneer in sharing collections across the country. While director of the Science Museum, from 1973 to 1986, she opened the first national museum outside London, the National Railway Museum in York. She also re-deployed resources from the London-focused museum to create the National Museum of Photography, Film and Television in Bradford, opened in 1983. These achievements had, and continue to have, a significant impact on the museum landscape of the Yorkshire region.

As well as creating a truly national museum group, Weston was ambitious in her collection development and took a strategic approach to collection facilities, acquiring a former airfield in Wroughton, near Swindon, to house large technological and transport objects. Weston also negotiated the transfer to the Science Museum of the Wellcome Collection of 100,000 objects, shifting the museum's emphasis from technology and physical sciences by embracing medicine.



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perhaps underestimated by others in national museums. She was direct, tough and impatient to get on with things, which she achieved by being both charming and unconventional. When she retired in 1986, the staff presented her with a motorbike as a gift.

She lived near Stroud in retirement but will be remembered by many who came across her in the Yorkshire region.
