We know that the needs of your museum are changing fast. For this reason, we are going to run two application rounds for support in 2021-22:

- a first round in January/February and

Online Abuse – A Toolkit for the Cultural Sector

According to a small survey conducted by The Space in 2019, 42% of respondents had received virulent criticism or attacks online, including online abuse, trolling and personal attacks, but few (17%) felt they knew how to deal with it.

The toolkit includes a checklist for getting through the Here and Now, including advice about how to check your privacy settings, how to report the abuse to the relevant platforms and (if appropriate) the authorities as well as a list of other resources that could help.
