

Collection Item Search Request

Do you have any yellow or blue crockery?

The Museum of North Craven Life in Settle are creating an exhibition and schools resources about Walter Morrison, a millionaire philanthropist and politician who lived at Malham Tarn House, North Yorkshire. He was a Liberal MP and a supporter of the party, until Gladstone introduced a bill for Home Rule in Ireland. Morrison, and many others in the Liberal party strongly opposed this. Mr Morrison was persuaded to stand in Skipton in the 1886 election for the newly formed 'Liberal Unionist Party'. He supposedly had all his yellow crockery buried with dead horses and purchased blue crockery to replace it when he changed party!

Here's where our request comes in: we don't know what this yellow or blue crockery might have looked like! Does anyone have in their collections mid-to-late 19th century crockery that is predominantly yellow or blue, which



they could let us use images of in our exhibition and schools resources? We would credit the images and can afford a small reproduction fee from the exhibition budget.
