They'll also be able to provide a preview of our cohorts that will be launched shortly.

We know that the needs of your museum are changing fast, so we are going to run two application rounds for support in 2021-22:

A surviving object from the Victorian hearth.



This is a basic nineteenth century domestic practical and ornamental object which raises a variety of challenges for the contemporary curator.

- 1. How would you describe it and what is its name? Is this universal or are there local variants? What other objects might it relate to in the museum's collection?
- 2. Who might have made, retailed, purchased or used this object? Did it have political, religious, cultural or other connotations in the mid-nineteenth century?
- 3. How might you address and present this object in the context of the climate crisis?
- 4. How might you address issues which might be raised in the current context by the figure celebrated here David Livingstone especially in the context of reassessing imperialism and de-colonising a museum's collections?
