
Take Part in Digital Takeover Day Friday 25 June

Shibden 600 Online Exhibition

Shibden Hall is 600 years old (the first reference to the Hall was in 1420/21) and to celebrate, Calderdale Museums are sharing a new 600-year timeline which was created with the research group 'Packed with Potential'. They've researched the past of Shibden Hall and will be sharing stories about the Hall's 600 years, with various families in occupation and nearly 100 years as a public museum.

Art Fund Headley Fellowships

The third round of Headley Fellowships with Art Fund has just opened, giving curators the time and resources to carry out research projects which deepen expertise and encourage knowledge sharing. There are 11 Fellowships on offer, for projects that could:

- Involve research into a part of the collections that a museum may not have the specialist expertise to use effectively, or where that specialist provision has been lost
- Interrogate collections through a decolonial lens
- Explore how collections and displays could be more relevant to communities.

A fellowship fee of up to £20,500 will fund a curator's time for up to six months; this can support backfilling an existing curator's post, increasing the hours of an existing part-time curator, or employing a freelance curator.

Covid Essentials Support Apply now to support reopening your museum!

Don't forget that we have got our Covid Essentials Fund to support your reopening. Even if you are looking to open later in the year, we can support you. Previous projects have included: purchase and installation of screens; hand sanitising stations; contactless donation and payment points; and the purchase of PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) but could support other things, such as an event for visitors or to recruit and train volunteers. We are looking for projects of up to £500 with no match funding. We try to turn the applications around in 7 days but there is a limited pot so get your applications in.

For speed and simplicity, we are using the existing small grant system.
