Sheffield Museums' Project Wins British Museum Marsh Award

The 'Museums by Mail' project, which recently received a Volunteers for Museum Learning Award, was established during lockdown to lift the spirits of those most in need and share the city's museum collections with people in Sheffield through the post.

Sheffield Museums' volunteers wrote and sent hundreds of postcards featuring artworks from Sheffield's collection, along with personal messages, to people across Sheffield – in particular, to elderly people and those in residential homes, who may have been feeling especially isolated during this challenging period.



Every postcard that went out was unique and came from the same place of kindness; a desire to help everyone find their way through the unprecedented circumstances brought about by the pandemic.



Leigh de Vries' Rotherham: A Relational Space - in association with Arts Council England, Rotherham Council, and MIND - will be a place for the local community to express their feelings around anxiety and related emotions, inspiring individual and collective reflection and interpersonal, intergenerational, connection.



By constructing rituals in public spaces that reveal

the depth of our inner lives, de Vries aims to activate Rotherham's collective psyche through dialogue around anxiety and other under-verbalised feelings of emotional distress. Visitors can share their thoughts with each other, chat with trained individuals on-site - or (as seen at The Rotherham Show in September) take part in the collective artwork by adding their responses/thoughts/feelings on anonymous notes.

The closing reception is a key part of de Vries' artistic development as it ties into their previous Arts Council-funded project 'MyBrokenReality' which examined body dysmorphia, engaged a diverse range of young people in Rotherham and was staged in Rotherham, London and Los Angeles.

Tackling Inequalities Hallmark Grants from AIM

Open for Applications

This year grants of up to £10,000 will be available to support projects addressing AIM's Tackling Inequality Hallmark.

AIM Hallmarks support Accredited Museums or museums Working Towards Accreditation in England, funded by Arts Council England through AIM's National Portfolio Organisation funding.

FCC Community Action Fund

Registered Charities, churches, Parish Councils, Local Authorities and CASC registered sports clubs can apply for grants of between £2,000 and £100,000 for the provision, maintenance, or improvement of community facilities.

This can include: Village Halls and Community Centres; Public Play Areas; Publicly available Multi use games areas; Skate parks and BMX tracks; Sport and recreation grounds including pavilions and clubhouses with full public access; Churches – community spaces only; Nature Reserves; Public gardens, parks, country parks and woodlands with at least dawn to dusk access; and Museums.

The Sir George Martin Trust

The Trust will give out grants for core, capital and project costs, mainly ranging from $\pounds 1,000 - \pounds 3,000$ to registered charities and churches doing outreach work who are striving to improve the well-being of residents in West Yorkshire. Don't Forget MDY Small Grants £2,250 to be Allocated by December

In 2021-22, the Small Grant Scheme is made possible by both Arts Council England and the Art Fund. The Art Fund investment is designed to support museums, **who** have not had any national recovery funds from ACE or NLHF, to recover from the pandemic. We have £2,250 left in the small grant budget and the majority of this must be allocated by the end of December

MDY's Small Grant Scheme helps museums to implement advice, test new ways of working and make good things happen. It can also support personnel to attend training courses and conferences. We offer grants of up to £3,000 (with two tiers of up to £1,000 and up to £3,000). We will require your museum to contribute in kind or in cash for each tier.

If you are interested in a bid in partnership with one or more eligible museums, contact a Museum Development Officer as we can increase the maximum grant to £3,000 per museum.

The fund is available on an open application basis, for all non-NPO museums who are Accredited or 'Working Towards'. All grants must be spent and claimed for within the financial year in which they are given.

Museums are encouraged to talk to a <u>Museum Development Officer</u> before making a submission. They will be able to guide your application and ensure you request the right support.
