## Wednesday 18 May National Lottery Project Grants - Unlocking Collections

Arts Council England (ACE) currently has a dedicated funding stream open to encourage museums to apply for its project grants. Museums that have not previously received ACE funding are especially encouraged to apply. These grants have fast turnaround times – 8 weeks for a decision for under £30,000, 12 weeks for over £30,000.

## **World Cultures: Multi Sensory Experience Inside the Test Space at Clifton Park Museum**

### Open from Sunday 22 May to 17 July

This new exhibition at Clifton Park Museum has been produced by Artworks SY - a collective of artists with learning disabilities, autism or both. Through a series of workshops, the ArtWorks artists have explored museum artefacts using the senses of touch, hearing, smell and sight to reimagine the museum experience into a multisensory one.

Visitors to the space are invited to interact with the exhibition. There are scents to be smelled, sounds to be listened to, objects to be touched and visual interpretations to be looked at. The ArtWorks artists would like to invite the public to participate in the research by recording their own experience of the display through different senses. These

## **Carbon Literacy for Museums**

# New Online Training Sessions in July, September, November 2022 and January 2023

Bookings are now open for you to gain Carbon Literacy certification. Courses are open to museums (including paid staff, volunteers and freelancers who work across all service areas) from Accredited Museums or those Working Towards Accreditation in



the North of England. Priority will be given to non-National museums. We advise that, where possible, two people from your organisation attend a course for peer support when developing actions.

By booking on a Carbon Literacy course, you are committing to undertake 7.5 hours of online training, split over a series of three sessions. We strongly encourage everyone who intends to use the Carbon Literacy Toolkit within their museum to gain Carbon Literacy certification first.
