Shanaz Gulzar, Chair of Bradford 2025 said: 'This is a huge opportunity to celebrate our extraordinary cultural heritage and for our young, ethnically diverse population – who have been so involved in shaping our bid – to become leaders and changemakers and begin a new chapter in our story. Bradford has been overlooked and underestimated for so long – it's now our time to shine.'



A World of Good at Wakefield Museum
