# Former Commonwealth Champion Donates Collection to Barnsley Museums

The team at Barnsley Museums are excited to acquire a new collection, kindly donated by Olympic runner Dorothy Hyman, who was one of the most famous female athletes in the 1960s. Dorothy won Sports Personality of the Year and medals across the board, including the Olympics, Commonwealth Games and World Championships. Dorothy was the daughter of a coal miner and with her father she trained on the streets and fields of Barnsley. It soon became clear Dorothy could run like the wind, and from pit field to a Tokyo stadium, her career skyrocketed. Interestingly, she never made any money from running and people in the community had to fundraise to buy her trainers. She later coached and worked a full time job for the Coal Board which she loved just as much as the running.



'Dorothy' and she doesn't tell them she used to run. She even says that the children in her family only know that she 'used to run a bit'. The objects that she has donated include iconic photographs, a running top from the Rome 100m Olympics and her Sports Personality of the Year award.

### **New Exhibition at Trolleybus Museum**

'Trolleybuses of the Humber' is a new exhibition at the Trolleybus Museum at Sandtoft which tells the untold stories of trolleybuses and the people who used them and worked on them in Hull, Grimsby and Cleethorpes. As well as information boards and photos it includes dioramas, models, a mannequin dressed in a replica wartime Grimsby conductress's uniform and the Museum's first oral history project, with a series of filmed interviews being available to watch on a touchscreen. This has been made possible by a grant from Humber Museums Partnership.



For the first time, from 22 - 26 August the Museum will be open on weekdays, with a trolleybus running and the exhibition room, cycle shop, toy museum and cinema all open. There will be no admission charge but we suggest that visitors make a donation. It makes a great day out during the school holidays.

Kiplin Hall and Gardens has been successful in a recent funding application to National Lottery Heritage Fund which will play a huge role in the future of our interpretation.

The project is a collaborative curation approach to design new interpretation for our welcome centre, two rooms in the hall and the gardens and grounds, and will look to broaden the stories we tell, the ways we tell them, and connect a broader audience to the stories that they are interested in.



This project is being made possible with £136,000 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, with thanks to National Lottery players. The project is also being funded with £2,000 from The Friends of Kiplin Hall, a bequest and money from our budgets.

The first phase of the Interpreting Kiplin 400 project is the recruitment of a Project Officer and an Evaluator to lead on the work, and recruitment is open on our website, see Jobs section.


