Art Fund and MDUK Recovery and Reset Grants 2022

Museum Development North West, Museum Development Yorkshire and Museum Development North East are pleased to launch Recovery and Reset Grants 2022, open to museums in the North of England.

Through Museum Development UK's continued partnership with Art Fund, Museum Development teams in the North of England have secured an additional £37,250 to add to a ring-fenced pot of £15,000 from our Arts Council England investment to award as Recovery and Reset Grants.

A single Accredited museum, or museum working towards Accreditation, can apply for up to £5,000. A partnership of museums or a museum service with multiple Accredited sites can apply for up to £7,500. Where a partnership of museums or a multi-site organisation is applying, the project must involve a minimum of two Accredited sites.

National Portfolio Organisations, nationally funded museums, English Heritage and National Trust properties are ineligible to apply, although they can be part of partnership bids.

Your Wellbeing

From Charity Finance Group (CFG):

'Employee wellbeing – the state of employees' mental and physical health, resulting from dynamics within, and sometimes outside, the workplace – is climbing the business agenda. And rightly so.

'Last week, the Royal College of Psychiatrists called on employers to do more to support people with mental health problems at work. The institution wants to see more help for employees with existing mental health illnesses and it wants employers to do more to prevent and mitigate mental illness. Around 16 million days of sickness absence is caused by mental health problems each year, costing businesses around £8.6 billion. But does it need to be this way? We don't think so.

'With this in mind, from Monday 15 to Friday 19 August 2022, the CFG team will be observing its summer wellbeing week. The whole team will be using this time away from work for R&R. Wellbeing weeks are not like annual leave. There's no pressure to hand work and projects over to colleagues before the out of office message go on because everyone is away from the office together'.
